Call for Contributions - ipb Colloquium Series "Politics from Below" Spring edition 2026

The ipb colloquium series offers an open and accessible space to present current research projects and receive constructive feedback. It is intended as a forum to share work-in-progress, exchange ideas, and engage in critical dialogue across disciplinary boundaries.

We welcome presentations from all researchers, early career (doctoral students and advanced master's students), and senior researchers alike!

We especially encourage contributions from interdisciplinary perspectives and regions beyond the classical scope of social movement research. Therefore, related submissions from fields such as educational science, regional studies, cultural studies, conflict studies, law, psychology, or philosophy are very welcome.

Format & Practical Information:

- Meetings will be online or in hybrid mode. Locations for in-person meetings will be communicated in advance.
- Each session lasts maximum 120 minutes. This includes circa 5-15 minutes of input by the paper presenters, followed by a public discussion.
- In the past, the Colloquium series has taken place at different intervals (i.e., monthly, bimonthly, irregular), the rhythm is adapted to presenters' availability and preferences.

- Presentations can be held in English or German. The language of the meeting will be communicated in advance.
- Each session will discuss a paper (in English or German), which will be circulated via the email list one week in advance, and is considered to be read by all participants. The papers can be draft chapters or articles (unpublished) as well as advanced research proposals that are no longer at a draft stage, and should not exceed 20 pages.
